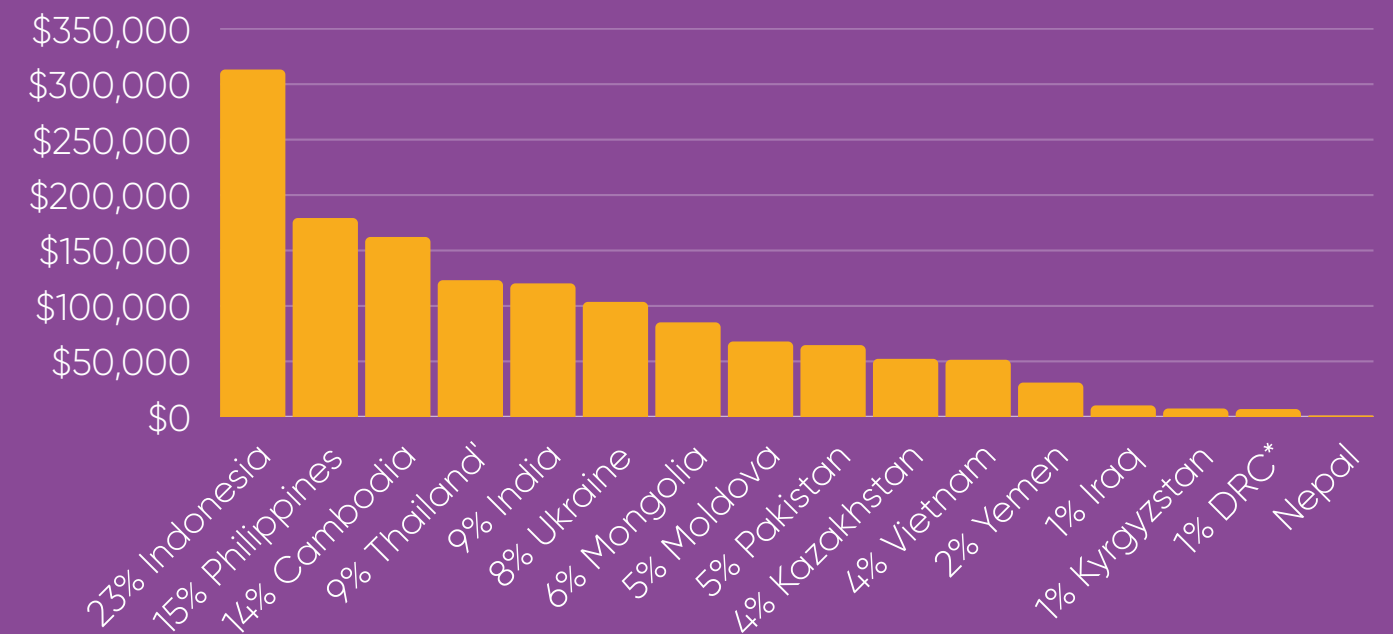

# Chair's Message

It is a great pleasure to present to you our annual report for our financial year 2025 (FY25). We look back with gratitude to God for the amazing things that we have seen Him do in many countries over the 60 years that FEBC Australia has been supporting our Partners overseas. Much has changed in technologies, approaches, personnel, Partner countries and languages broadcast, but God's love has been constantly proclaimed and demonstrated.

Most significantly in FY25, we introduced new impact indicators to assist us to continuously improve our mission pursuit. For the first time, a small group of our Partners collectively documented 19,904 people confirming they've become believers of Jesus Christ. We are celebrating every soul saved, and recognise that many more are likely to have made the same decision.

As part of my role on the FEBC International Executive Committee and as Chair of FEBC Australia, I have had the opportunity this year to engage closely with our broadcast Partners and fellow leaders across the FEBC network.

In these meetings, many people shared stories of what God is doing through the projects supported by FEBC Australia and its members. I was reminded of 1 Corinthians 3, where it says that, regardless of who plants, it is God who gives the increase. This report will provide examples of that truth.

I am grateful for the support of our Board during the year. We said goodbye to Trish Hopper and Pui Cheung. Their nearly 4 years of commitment is greatly appreciated. We welcomed Alex Mansfield to the Board and appointed Gerda Kusmandono, who will join us in FY26. All give their time freely and willingly and are invested in ensuring sound governance and supporting the work of the staff and the mission of FEBC Australia.

This year, the Board has undertaken a renewed period of strategic planning, with a focus on strengthening engagement with supporters and ensuring our overseas Partners are well supported into the future. The Board is grateful for the leadership of our CEO, Janet

Cousens, in these challenging times when income is declining as people face cost-of-living pressures and there is a need to focus more on engaging the next generation. To that end, the Board has carefully decided to use a portion of reserves to invest in improved systems and processes for supporter engagement, with the aim of strengthening sustainability and long-term mission impact.

On behalf of the Board, I thank our members for their faithful involvement in the mission of making Jesus known. This is often where it is difficult or impossible for other organisations to go because of conflict, persecution, movement restrictions or lack of resources. Some 3 billion people have yet to hear in their heart language and we want to continue partnering with you until all have heard.

# CEO's Message

As we reflect on the financial year 2025, we are so grateful. In 2025, we celebrated 60 years of ministry and gave thanks for the hundreds of thousands of people who have encountered Jesus Christ through FEBC's ministry. We deeply appreciate every Partner, supporter, and prayerful friend who has journeyed with us. Thank you.

Throughout FY25, we continued to share the gospel through media, from shortwave radio to smartphone apps, and saw strong collaboration on initiatives to reach younger generations. Alongside broadcasting, ministry sometimes required first demonstrating the love of Christ through practical support, creating trust and openness for the gospel to take root. We also remained committed to strengthening our Partners' ministries and caring for their staff.

In FY25, we took important first steps to strengthen our engagement with supporters in Australia, with a focus on supporting the ongoing sustainability of our broadcast Partners. This work was shaped by input from our broadcast Partners and feedback from more than 400 supporters. I am deeply thankful for our staff and Board, who have approached this season with wisdom, unity, and a shared commitment to the mission.

This year, I have met believers who first encountered Christ through FEBC media, who have been imprisoned for sharing the gospel and heard of others who lost their lives for refusing to deny Christ. We've also learnt of whole families who have accepted Christ after hearing the Word of God on the radio, and others who have become the first believers in their village. These stories, alongside the faithfulness of our Partners and supporters, continue to inspire us as we pursue the Great Commission together.

Despite these challenges, in FY25 we celebrated an incredible 19,904 people receiving Christ as their Saviour—a conservative figure provided by a small group of our Partners able to collect this data. With a potential reach of over 91 million people across 109 languages, we trust many more have encountered God's love through our ministry.

One of those reached is Mai\*, a young woman who first met Jesus through a radio program in her heart language. "Hearing songs about God, faith, and worship in my mother tongue changed my life," she shared. "I now walk with Jesus every day."

Stories like Mai's remind us that God multiplies simple acts of obedience in sharing His word. My prayer is that this Annual Report gives glory to God, honours the faithfulness of our supporters, and reflects the shared journey we are on together.

By His authority and grace, we will continue sharing God's love through media with the least reached—**until all have heard**.

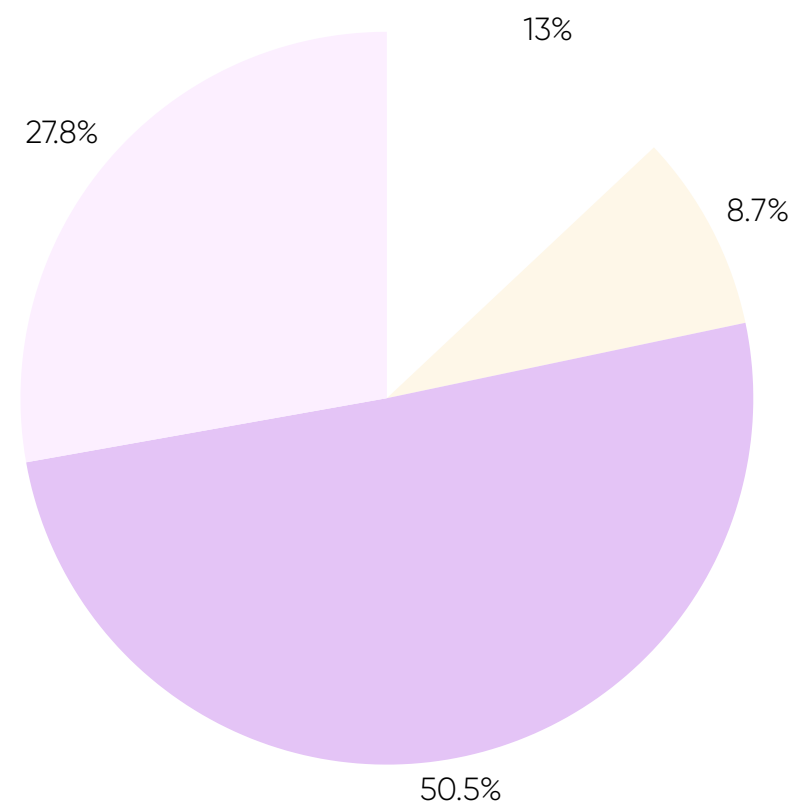

# Areas of Impact

FEBC Australia's desired impact is that people become disciples of Christ, that their lives are transformed by His love, and they, in turn, shape their communities. We are so grateful for the dedication of our supporters and the skill of our broadcast Partners for making this possible.

Our approach, informed by learning with our broadcast Partners, is to support programs across four integrated areas: broadcasting, community engagement, discipleship and sustainability. This chart identifies the percentage of funds allocated for each area of impact in FY25, with the following pages including details on achievements.

In 1969, a radio broadcast in Hmong brought the gospel to Hmongs for the first time. 300,000 came to Christ. In FY25, Hmong and other ethnic language broadcasters attended a livestream training, thanks to the financial support of our supporters. Over 3 million listeners now hear the gospel over livestream and through social media, plus many others who engage via mobile applications.

# Speaking the Good News, through media, to those still waiting to hear

Media breaks barriers—geographical and cultural. In FY25, our Partners shared the gospel in 109 languages, with locally produced programs bringing Jesus' love in ways people truly understand. From radio waves reaching remote villages or secret believers, to social media inspiring urban youth, and WhatsApp groups supporting new believers, media continues to multiply our reach.

In 2025, our Partner in Kyrgyzstan became one of the most popular stations in Osh, the nation's second largest city. They inspired people to follow Jesus through a great mix of shows using Biblical wisdom to help families and communities thrive. Whether people tuned in on radio, checked their phones, scrolled social media, or called into the station, they were finding answers and receiving hope.

# Love in action - bringing God's love to life

Together with our Partners, we brought God's love to life through community engagement activities that also introduced people to FEBC media. In 2024/2025, we supported programs providing disaster recovery, counselling for listeners in a war-zone, teaching sign language and sewing skills development, and opportunities for people to share their own voice through radio. God's love was expressed in practical ways that changed lives!

## 'Roshan Ghar' (Bright Home) project

 Pakistan



The *Roshan Ghar* ('Bright Home') project helped marginalised rural communities discover that Jesus loves them and that they have God-given potential. Together, we addressed poverty, family violence, and health challenges while empowering women to become agents of change.

Through free sewing classes, many women started earning income for the first time, and grew in faith as they listened to devotionals on speaker boxes. Our Partner's medical clinics brought healing and hope. Most importantly, lives were transformed as people experienced Jesus' love in practical ways.

## Growing disciples to transform communities

Making disciples is part of Jesus' Great Commission, and it's also on our hearts to make disciples that make disciples.

With your support in FY25, discipleship multiplied the fruit of ministry. We saw lives transformed as our Partners worked with local churches, invested in their growth and equipped them to reach others for Christ. Through Bible Institutes, seminars, and youth training we also saw believers discover their calling and stepping out to share Jesus. **Southeast Asia**



FEBC Ethnic Ministry invested deeply in equipping ethnic believers and leaders across Southeast Asia in 2025. Around 10,000 Khmu, Kin Mun, Mien, Tai Dam, Hmong, Akha and Lisu believers and leaders attended leadership and Bible training, and 640 Hmong and Mien youth attended youth camps. Because of these efforts, church leaders have connected across their distant villages and are better equipped to teach God's Word, whilst young people have caught the vision to reach their peers for Christ.

Each step helped Partners stand strong, grow their ministries, and continue to share Jesus' love in places where His name is rarely heard. Together, we were not just meeting immediate needs—we were laying foundations for lasting impact.

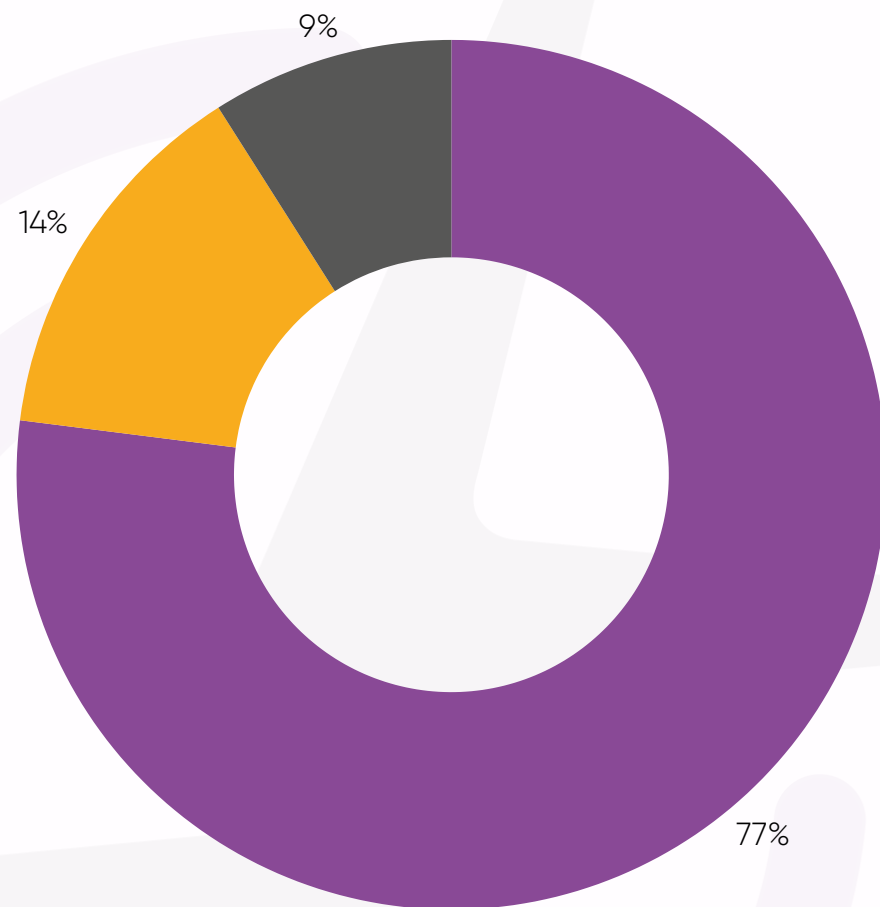

Where did the money come from in 2024/25?

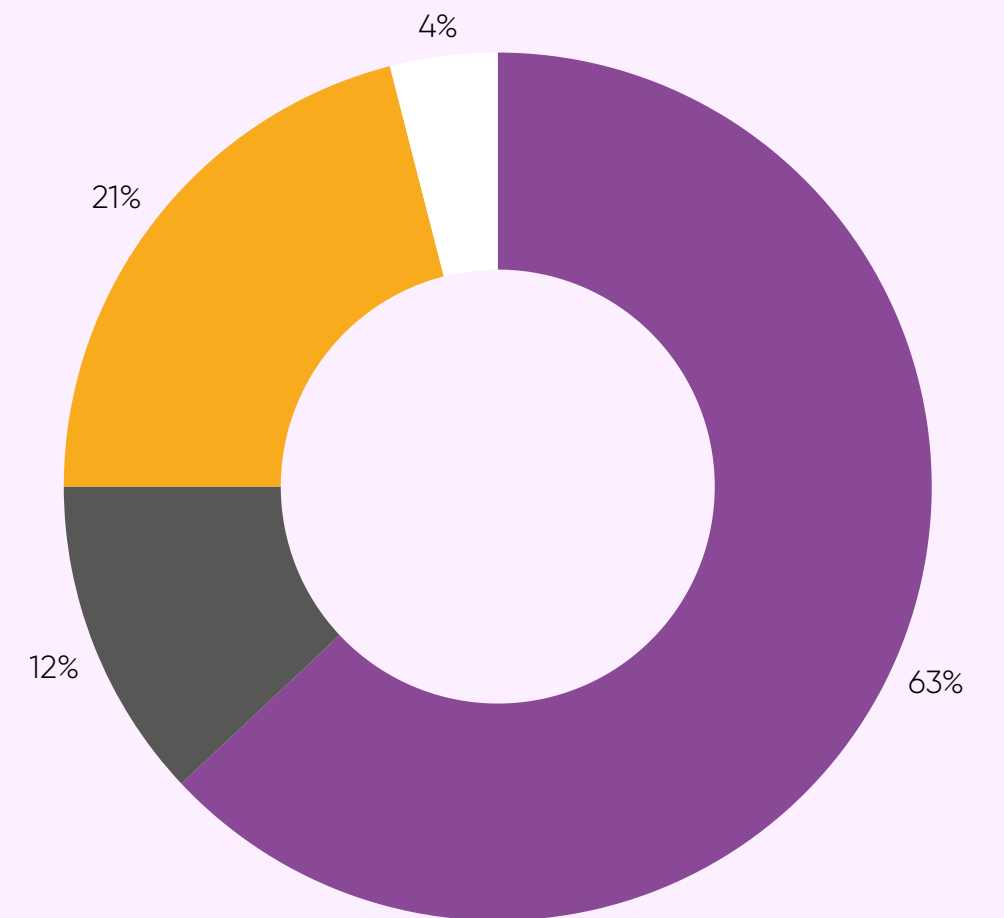

## Financial health



We are grateful that FEBC Australia remains in a strong financial position, with healthy reserves that enable us to commit to multi-year projects and respond quickly when emergencies arise. In 2023, the Board approved a strategy to wisely invest reserves built up during COVID into new overseas projects over the next five years—ensuring resources are directed where they can make the greatest impact. In 2025, the Board approved use of reserves to build our fundraising capacity for the future. The strategy for use of reserves means a deficit budget while we build the program capacity of our broadcast Partners, and our own sustainability for the future.

Our financial priorities are clear:

- Growing and sustaining long-term commitments with Partners
- Supporting short-term project needs
- Helping Partners strengthen sustainability and planning
- Exploring new mission opportunities
- Responding to disasters and urgent needs
- Ensuring FEBC Australia remains sustainable

The Board and finance team continue to steward every donation with care. Finances are monitored closely, audited annually, and remain fully compliant with ACNC External Conduct Standards. Together, we're building a mission that is both enduring and responsive.

### Reserves and program health

Our Board continues to steward reserves and investments with care, ensuring we can sustain current projects and expand into new mission fields. Clear partnership agreements, regular reporting, and close project monitoring strengthen accountability and build trust with you, our supporters.

Above all, we give thanks to God for His faithfulness in enabling us to meet every commitment this year. With His guidance, and your ongoing partnership, we look forward to serving communities worldwide with love and hope.

He was awarded a Public Service Medal in the Queen's Birthday Honours for his services to science and is a Fellow of the Australian Academy of Technological Sciences and Engineering.

As Chair of FEBC Australia's Board, Ron provides governance oversight and sits on the Finance Committee and the Projects Committee.
