Small Voices,

Big Transformation in Indonesia

Two years ago, we shared with you that our team in Indonesia had quietly begun something seemingly simple.

They had begun a daily devotional program in schools called *Berpertualang Dalam Kerajaan Allah* (BDKA), which translates to “Adventures in the Kingdom of God”.

Sharing God’s Word in a Digital World

Young people across Indonesia had become less interested in reading and increasingly influenced by social media. Our Partners saw the need to help children refocus and regain their attention span. They also recognised the opportunity to engage children and families in a new way by sharing the Bible through YouTube—making it relevant and accessible. The program teaches children to start their day in quiet time, engaging with God in His Word and in prayer through a video series of Bible stories.

Today, what began as a small step of faith has grown into something extraordinary.

The team is now reaching around 3,000 children across 28 locations in Indonesia, a country where Christians are the minority. Many of these children are discovering who Jesus is for the first time and are asking questions that reveal a deep hunger to know Him more.

Growth Beyond Imagination

The program is now being incorporated into the regular school curriculum in both private and public schools in some areas in Indonesia. Teachers across Indonesia are volunteering to engage and promote BDKA for children in their region. Praise God for this remarkable increase!

It’s not only the children who are getting to know Jesus, but as Scripture is being read every day in the classrooms, the teachers, some of whom are not Christian, are also hearing about Jesus.

Through God’s favour, we’ve seen support from local churches, local governments and the Ministry of Religion help enable this uptake of His Word across the country.

The impact is being felt far beyond the classroom. The team also does outreach and follow-up events, from which they have heard children share how the daily program is shaping their lives. Some speak of improved relationships at home.



“I used to be naughty, didn’t listen to my parents and often argued, but after 2 years of reading the Bible, my mother said it was different, I listened more.”

Others say they are spending less time caught up in unhealthy social media habits. Many are now telling their friends about what they are learning from the Bible.

God's Love Reaches

Cambodia's Displaced

Late last year, as tensions along the Cambodia-Thailand border rose, communities living near the conflict were deeply affected.

Tens of thousands were displaced as parents, children and elderly fled, leaving their homes to seek safety. Immediate aid, as well as emotional and spiritual support was critically needed for those impacted by the crisis.

Thankfully, FEBC's team in Cambodia, *Voice of Love Cambodia*, was ready to respond.

Showing God's Love in Action

Alongside other organisations, they worked with local authorities to provide 500 food and essential relief packages, radios and audio speaker boxes to displaced families.

This was more than practical relief. The team was showing and pointing people to God's love in places marked by fear.

Many families have shared their gratitude with Voice of Love Cambodia; the support they've received has given them strength to face another day and a renewed hope during these uncertain times. Through Voice of Love Cambodia's broadcasts and compassionate presence, many are hearing about Jesus for the very first time. In the midst of overwhelming circumstances, they're

discovering a God who sees them, loves them, and walks with them—so they never face their struggles alone.

Beyond on-the-ground physical aid, Voice of Love's broadcasts are a lifeline. Broadcasts on government updates, Bible verses and prayers bring vital information and hope to those caught in the conflict zone. They have also brought comfort to families of soldiers on the frontline.

"My husband serves on the front line in the army, and each day I live with concern, fear, and constant prayer for his safety. There are moments when my heart feels heavy and uncertain about tomorrow. Through prayer and listening to God's Word, I am reminded that God is leading my way, protecting my family, and walking with us through every challenge. God never leaves us and His love surrounds us always. I am deeply thankful to Voice of Love for giving me an Audio Bible Box, which has become a daily source of comfort, strength, and hope for my heart."

Heart-to-heart

From Searching to Serving in Mongolia

Before Tamir believed in Christ, he felt alone and unlucky.

Faith was distant. God felt unfamiliar.

When Tamir was 12, he stepped into a Christian church for the first time. He heard people singing praises to God. Though he didn't understand what he was hearing, something stirred in his heart and that moment stayed with him. For years, Christ was rarely spoken of in his life, but the seed lay quietly in the soil.

God Speaks Through Radio

Years later, now 19 years old, Tamir encountered Christ again—this time through the radio. Driving in his car, he was flicking through stations when he chanced upon FEBC's broadcast. He stopped and listened. Hearing the presenter explain Scripture in simple, direct language amazed him. What he had once thought of as foreign now felt personal, like God was speaking directly to him.

A little while later, he and his friends began spending time at a church, not for worship but just as a place to drink alcohol. As he walked up the steps one day, he realised it was the same church he had visited as a child.

The following Sunday he returned, this time to attend the service. As the singing began, the same sense of peace he had felt as a 12-year-old washed over him again. He knew then that God had been at work all along.

Sharing the Hope He Found

Today, Tamir serves as a radio presenter for FEBC, sharing the Good News with others, praying that

someone listening, perhaps driving alone in their car, might encounter Jesus as he did.

Since joining FEBC, Tamir has seen his life transform. The old has gone. He now lives renewed in Christ, with a deep desire to see others come to know God.

Through him and other FEBC Mongolian broadcasters, thousands are hearing the gospel on-air and online, and the seeds sown are taking root and bearing fruit.
